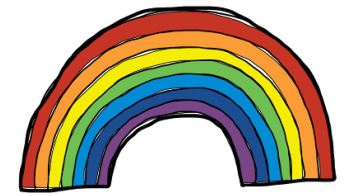

You could use your own name as the country name: e.g. Jones land Evans Island The Republic of Megan</p> <p>You will need to :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Draw a map of the country showing the capital city and any rivers, lakes or mountains.
<p>Choose a times table that you know and see how fast you can write it down. Then, practise one you don't know and see how fast you can write it down. See if you can speed up writing the tables that you don't know. Ask an adult or a friend to time you and keep a record of your times. Date completed</p>	<p>Sentences. A noun is the name of a thing. An adjectives tells you something about the thing. a pink jumper, a soft pillow. A verb tells you about an action and an adverb tells you how it's done. walking quickly silently creeping. <p>You are going to create a tally chart! Choose a book, newspaper or magazine. Choose one page. You are going to keep a tally of these words: the and because we had How many times does each word appear on the page? What is the most common word? Now choose 1 sentence from the same page. Make a tally of the vowels (a e I o u) that are in the sentence. What is the most common letter? Date completed</p>	<p>Think of a place that you know really well. It could be a place that you have been to on holiday or your own garden or bedroom. You are going to describe the place using your five senses. If you stood in this place what would you see, hear, smell, touch and, if possible, taste. You might not be able to do taste but think as hard as you can! make the person reading your description picture the place. Date completed</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design a flag for your country. • Design a typical house from your country. Try to make it as different from our homes as you can. • Draw a poster for your country to encourage people to go there on holiday. Think of a really catchy slogan. <i>"Marvellous Megania Makes Memories."</i> <p>You can use ICT devices, phones, tablets. iPads, paper and pencil etc. Spread out the activities over the week.</p> <p>You can be creative in how you present this task. e.g. You could show your ideas as a PowerPoint or on paper.</p>
<p>Choose three 2d shapes. For example, a square, a triangle and a pentagon. Can you draw a pattern using the shapes that you chose? How can you make them fit together? Can you add a fourth shape to the pattern? Date completed</p>	<p>Write a review of a film, TV programme or game that you know well. What are the good things about it? What are the bad things about it? Would you recommend it to a friend? Give it a rating out of 10! Make sure that you choose something you know really well. Date completed</p>	
<p>Doubling and halving. Write down 10 numbers. Double each of those numbers and then double the answer. Keep going until you can't do any more in your head. Can you start with a bigger number? Can you double a number greater than 100? Can you double a decimal number? Write down all your answers. Then, choose 10 new numbers and see if you can halve them. What is the biggest number you can halve in your head? Can you halve a number and then halve it again? 20 1 Date completed</p>	<p>Spelling. Choose 6 new words from your list that you have been given and write them in interesting sentences. Try to make each sentence have a different start. Underline the word that you used! Ask an adult to test you on your spelling of these words! (You can do more than 6 if you would like to!) Date completed</p>
