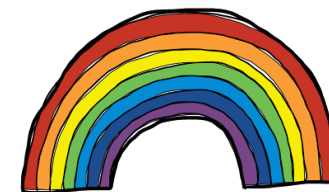

Home Learning Topic Task Task Overview

You have been directed by the Welsh government to build a new Welsh Castle.

Below is a list of the tasks you need to think of:

- What will your castle look like?
- draw a picture.
- What will your castle be called?
- Give it a Welsh name!
- Draw a map to show visitors how to get to the new Castle.
- Design a Welsh themed shield with an emblem for the castle.
- Create a poster to advertise your Castle using persuasive language tempting people to visit.
- Record yourself talking about

Round numbers to the nearest 100.

Write ten 3-digit numbers and round them to the nearest 10. Remember units below 5 round down, and units 5 and over round up.

Eg $136 - 100$
 $273 - 300$

Too easy? Try 4-digit numbers and round them to the nearest 10. Make sure you think of Thousands, Hundreds, Tens and Units.

To use antonyms.

Choose 10 adjectives and they have to find the opposite for that word and use it in a sentences. E.g small – huge. The giraffe's huge neck peeped over the fence.

Too easy? Use WOW vocabulary and adjectives.

<p>Can you covert times?</p> <p>Write down 5 times eg 2.30pm – and to turn them into the written time eg half past 2 in the afternoon. Or draw the time using hands on a clock and convert it to digital time.</p> <p>Too easy? Children to also convert to 24 hr clock (17:15)</p> <p>Date completed</p>	<p>Plan a letter.</p> <p>Plan a letter to a pen friend that you haven't seen in a while. Think about who it is to / why you haven't seen them in so long / what you have been doing since you last saw them / what news you want to share with them. Make some notes.</p> <p>Too easy? Organise your ideas into subheadings and include some WOW words.</p> <p>Date completed</p>	<p>the Castle, using persuasive language to encourage people to buy or use the product.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write a welsh themed menu for the castle shop. - Design a suit of armour. <p>You can use ICT devices such as phones, tablets and iPads. Or you can choose to use pen and paper to complete these tasks. Spread these activities out over the week.</p> <p>Be as creative as you can!</p>
<p>Can you find out what the time will be?</p> <p>Rite down 5 different times in your book – work and write what the time will be in half an hour and an hour?</p> <p>Too easy? What will the time be in 15 minutes / in 45 minutes</p> <p>Date completed</p>	<p>Write a letter following your plan.</p> <p>Using your plan write your letter. Remember to include your address, and the address of the person you're sending it to. Make sure you include your greeting (dear...). Ask the reader some questions using suitable punctuation. Sign off appropriately E.g. yours sincerely / yours faithfully.</p> <p>Too easy? Use paragraphs to separate the different sections of the letter.</p> <p>Date completed</p>	
<p>Can you record a timetable of their day?</p> <p>Record what you do at different times of the day. What time does that activity start and what time does it finish?</p> <p>Too easy? Work out the duration time of each activity.</p> <p>Date completed</p>	<p>Find synonyms for words.</p> <p>Brainstorm more interesting words than said (eg bellowed, whispered, screeched, giggled, chuckled etc</p> <p>Can you write them into an interesting speech sentence?</p> <p>Eg 'Stop that right now' bellowed mum down the corridor.</p> <p>Too easy? Find synonyms for nice, big, kind.</p> <p>Date completed</p>
