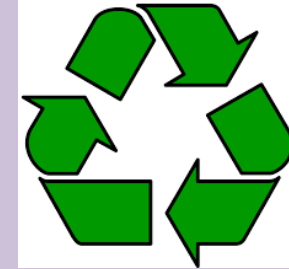
Compound Words
