<b>Maths and Numeracy</b>	<b>Create a bar chart or pictogram</b> to show your family's or friends' favourite Welsh foods, places, or sports teams.	<b>Make a timetable</b> for a day out in Wales using 12-hour or 24-hour clock. Include activities, travel time, and breaks.
<b>Languages, Literacy and Communication</b>	<b>Write a short paragraph in Welsh</b> introducing yourself (e.g., "Fy enw i ydy... Dw i'n hoffi..."). Use vocabulary we've learned in class.	<b>Write or retell a Welsh myth or legend</b> (e.g., The Giant of Snowdon or The Lady of the Lake). Add illustrations if you wish!
<b>Science and Technology</b>	<b>Make a fact sheet about a Welsh animal</b> (e.g., red kite, badger, puffin). Include where it lives, what it eats, and an illustration.	<b>Use a digital tool</b> (e.g., PowerPoint, Canva, iMovie) to make a short presentation about your favourite place in Wales.
<b>Expressive Arts</b>	<b>Design a Welsh flag</b> with symbols that represent <i>you</i> and your identity. Write a short description of what each part means.	<b>Learn and perform a Welsh song or dance</b> (e.g. <i>Calon Lân, Dawnsio Gwerin</i> ). Record or perform it for the class.
<b>Humanities</b>	<b>Research a famous Welsh person</b> (e.g. Roald Dahl, Gareth Bale, Betsi Cadwaladr). Create a fact file or mini biography.	<b>Draw a map of Wales</b> and label cities, rivers, mountains, and a place that is special to you or your family
<b>Health and Wellbeing</b>	<b>Create a healthy Welsh menu</b> for a day. Include breakfast, lunch, and dinner using traditional or local ingredients.	<b>Make a 'My Welsh Identity' poster</b> with pictures and words showing what makes you feel Welsh or proud of Wales.
